BUT THERE ARE SOME THINGS THAT YOU CANNOT BE SURE OF. YOU MUST TAKE A CHANCE.

Ecclesiastes 11:4 goes on to tell us: If you wait for perfect weather, you will never plant your seeds. If you are afraid that every cloud will bring rain, you will never harvest your crops.

This past May brought us some pretty awesome weather. We had quite a bit of August in May.

Did we expect that? Perhaps not. On Memorial Day we expected cold and rainy weather, but we persevered and held Holy Mass at the parish cemetery. The rain stopped, the sky cleared, and the sun came out. It was perfect. Every cloud did not bring rain.

In our faith lives - which should define the entirety of our lives - Ecclesiastes advises us that taking a chance, setting aside worry, is worth it. In fact in Matthew 6.25-34 Jesus commands his followers not to worry. He even goes so far as to say that worrying is a characteristic of an unbeliever.

We are called to be the same kind of risk takers the Apostles and saints were because if we take those risks we build the Kingdom. Setting fear aside and taking chances in small things leads to doing so in bigger ways.

We realize that even if we make a few mistakes or get rejected once and awhile God will work it all out for good.

Indeed, God makes good use of us if we only trust and move forward with Him. Moses had a speech impediment and told God, "I can't talk." Gideon told God, "I'm too young." Abraham said, "I'm too old." Yet look at what God accomplished with them once they trusted in Him and accepted His call.



Clergy Pension - Donate and Pray

Did you know that retired priests receive a pension from the Church? On Father's Day, we are asked to make donations toward that pension fund. They are so very needed.



Why pray – because, frankly, the picture above says it all - pennies. Our pension plan is so poor that our retired clergy often end up impoverished. A retired priest and his spouse receive a total of \$600 per month. They loose their housing and all the other benefits they had as active clergy and must venture out to live on that meager amount. They sacrificed their lives for their flock, must they sacrifice again? Should the priest die, the widow is left with \$300 a month. A shame!

Father's Day

On Sunday, June 16th we honor all fathers, grandfathers, godfathers,



spiritual fathers, and those special men in our lives that exemplify the strength and

dedication of fatherhood in our lives. We will also have a wonderful breakfast following 10am Holy Mass.

Within the family community, the man is called upon to live his gift and role as husband and father. We can look to the example of sacrificial love exemplified by St. Joseph and if we see these traits in the men around us we know that they are working with God.

Let us pray for God's blessing on our faithful fathers - those who are with us and for the eternal rest of those who have merited eternal life.

May - June The Solemnity and Octave of Corpus Christi


On May 30th we celebrated the Solemnity of Corpus Christi – the Body of Christ.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is a religious manifestation and confession of our Eucharistic faith. By the presence and active participation in the liturgy Catholics publicly profess their faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This is a time when

Catholics show their love for Christ by honoring Him in a public way and show their love for their neighbors by bringing the Lord and Savior closer to them.


The Solemnity of Corpus Christi has been solemnly celebrated in parishes of the Polish National Catholic Church since her organization. Its complete celebration lasts for eight days, an Octave.

A New Solemnity



Word of God Sunday is our newest solemnity in the PNCC, and will be celebrated this year on June 9th. It is designed in our Church to be observed the Sunday after Corpus Christi Sunday. The liturgical color is white, and the readings are found in the PNCC ordo (liturgical calendar). The Word of God Sunday is a very important occasion for us, because of the uniqueness of the Word of God as Sacrament in the PNCC. May we give thanks and praise to God for His Many Blessings!

The Sacred Heart



Christ's Sacred Heart of love is expressed most profoundly in the Blessed Sacrament. The Eucharist. Jesus' giving of Himself, is celebrated joyously on Corpus Christi and in its Octave. At the end of the Octave we celebrate the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Devotion to the Eucharist and to the Sacred Heart are as inseparable as devotion is to the mystery of Christ's human and Divine love. In the Sacred Host dwells the Godman, Jesus; in His Person pulses His Heart of flesh through which we are loved with the perfection of His

humanity, the fullness of His Godhead, one Person who not only loves but is Love.

Let us use the month of June to get acquainted or re-acquainted with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. You'll be glad you did!

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a wonderful historical expression of our piety for Christ. It calls us to conversion, love, gratitude, and dedication to Christ and His saving work.

There are two things that should meet in devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's Heart of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine Heart of Christ insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us.

You can find a Litany to the Sacred Heart in your PNCC Prayerbook on page 123.

Almighty and eternal God, look upon the Heart of Thy Most beloved Son, and upon the praise and satisfaction He offers Thee on behalf of sinners, and when they come to Thee imploring Thy mercy, graciously pardon them, in the name of Thy Son Jesus Christ, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.

Admonition is God's antibiotic for the church; done Biblically, it is the most loving thing we can do ... for all concerned.

Now, as we're thinking about that person that God might just want us to be His voice to speak into their life, do we love them? Do we love them enough to tell the truth? 
